The National Broadband Plan

Access


The aim of the programme is to ensure every premises has access to high-speed broadband.

Intervention Area

DECC identified all premises in the country that don't have access to high-speed broadband – this is called the Intervention Area or Amber area.

Intervention Area

NBI have been contracted to build a full fibre network to connect the 544,000+ premises ensuring no one is left behind.



AMBER areas - the target areas for the State intervention of the National Broadband Plan **BLUE** areas - where commercial operators are delivering or have indicated plans to deliver high speed broadband services.


Our promise is to deliver a network that will be fit for future generations.



• 174,000+ premises have been surveyed to date and 136,000+ premises progressing through or completed detail design.

• 500+ premises available for connection in Carrigaline & Cavan Deployment Areas, increasing daily.

35 Retail Service Providers have signed
 Contracts with NBI to deliver services once the network is built

• 113 BCP sites live, plus 31 schools

NBI team has grown to ~900 with ~192 FTE

Premises available for connection increasing daily.







NBI's Network Design and Build Process



How a network 'works'


- When a premise connects to the internet, the data goes to a Local Exchange.
- From there the local exchange sends the data to the Regional Exchange.
- Then the data is sent to Data Centres, this is where to most internet traffic ends up. These are primarily in Dublin.
- Primary Data Path
- → Backup Data Path



How we're rolling out the NBI network


The NBI network is designed on 227 **Deployment Areas**, each with a **Local** or **Regional Exchange** at its core.

- 33 Regional Exchanges Regional Exchanges are our backbone and connect us directly connected to to the Data Centres. We build these first.
- 194 Local Exchanges
 All local exchanges connect to their nearest
 Regional Exchange. These areas are built after the
 Regional Exchange area is built.
- Exchanges will all connect back to Data Centres, most are based in Dublin



Regional Exchanges

- Deployment Areas that have a Regional Exchange area are built first.
- This is to ensure we have a solid backhaul network connection back to Data Centres.
- Deployment Area around the Regional Exchange is ~20km in radius.




Local Exchanges

- Once the Deployment Area with the Regional Exchange is built, we then connect to an adjacent Deployment area with a Local Exchange and build out from there.
- Each Deployment Area is ~20km in diameter.
- Local Exchanges send data via the Regional Exchange to the Data Centres.


Why not build Local Exchanges first?

 Building Local Exchanges first would mean a delay in getting premises connected as the link to the Data Centres via the Regional Exchange would be missing.



If we built a Local Exchange first.

 If we built a Local Exchange first, there would be no connection back to the Data Centres.






Kilkenny

County Kilkenny Overview

- There are ~18,300 premises in Co. Kilkenny without access to high-speed broadband.
- This represents 38% of the total premises in the county.
- Government will invest ~€72m in building NBP in Co. Kilkenny.



County Kilkenny Network



- NBI will connect the Regional Exchanges first to establish connection back to Data Centres.
- We build out from the Regional Exchanges ~20km
- Once the Deployment Areas with Regional Exchanges are built, we then spread the build to adjacent Local Exchanges.









Kilkenny Deployment Area

- Survey works underway have started in the Kilkenny Deployment Area – Regional Exchange
- Status: Survey Underway
- 2619 Premises in this Deployment Area of which ~2614 premises are in Co. Kilkenny.
- Estimated Connection Dates between: October 2022 March 2023




Waterford Deployment Area

- Surveying underway in the Waterford
 Deployment Area Regional Exchange
- Status: Survey Underway
- 5,255 Premises in this Deployment Area
 of which ~1914 premises are in Co. Kilkenny.
- Estimated Connection Dates between:
 April 2022 September 2022



Johnstown Deployment Area

- Build Works have started in the Johnstown
 Deployment Area Local Exchange
- Status: Survey Underway
- 2,542 premises in this Deployment Area of which ~1476 premises are in Co. Kilkenny.
- Estimated Connection Dates between: December 2022 May 2023



Borris Deployment Area

- Build Works have started in the Borris
 Deployment Area Local Exchange
- Status: Survey Underway
- 3,441 premises in this Deployment Area of which ~1536 premises are in Co. Kilkenny.
- Estimated Connection Dates between: November 2022 April 2023





BCP Update

Broadband Connection Points

In 2020 and early 2021 NBI will also connect 270+ Broadband Connection Points (BCPs)

- Sites are located across all 26 counties
- These points will provide free high-speed internet access with many offering remote working capabilities.
- BCPs have been selected by local authority BBOs and submitted to the Department of Rural & Community Development. They are subject to change & schools will only provide educational access for pupils or any post school activities.
- The objective of BCPs is to ensure high speed connectivity for those in the IA in the short term


