

DRAFT PRIVACY STATEMENT

for statutory functions related to the Electoral Register

Who are we?

Kilkenny County Council is the democratically elected organisation whose principal function is to provide a broad range of services in areas such as Housing, Roads & Transportation, Flood Prevention, Water Services, Economic Development & Tourism, Planning & Conservation, Environmental Protection, Heritage & the Arts, Library Services, Community & Culture, Amenity, Sport & Recreation, Fire Services, Energy, Older People & Age Friendly, Children & Younger People, Financial Management & Customer Services development.

In performing its functions, Kilkenny County Council is required to collect and process significantamounts of "personal data" within the meaning of the General Data Protection Regulations [GDPR] and of the Data Protection Acts 1988 to 2018. The Council respects the privacy rights of those whose personal data we process and we are conscious of our obligations under the Data Protection Acts. Kilkenny County Council is a Registration Authority. We are required by law to prepare and publish a Register of Electors every year.

Why do we have a privacy statement?

Kilkenny County Council has created this privacy statement in order to demonstrate our firm commitment to privacy and to assure you that in all your dealings with Kilkenny County Council, we will ensure the security of the data you provide to us. Kilkenny County Council creates, collects and processes a significant amount of personal data in various multiple formats on a daily basis. Kilkenny County Council's commitment is that the personal data you are required to supply to us is;

- Obtained lawfully, fairly and in a transparent manner
- Obtained for only specified, explicit and legitimate purposes
- Adequate, relevant and limited to what is necessary for purpose for which it was obtained
- Recorded, stored accurately and securely and where necessary kept up to date
- Kept only for as long as is necessary for the purposes for which it was obtained.
- Kept in a form which permits identification of the data subject
- Processed only in a manner that ensures the appropriate security of the personal data including protection against unauthorised or unlawful processing

Data Protection Policy

Kilkenny County Council has a detailed Data Protection Policy which outlines how we as a public body are committed to ensuring the security of any personal data you provide to us.

What is the activity referred to in this Privacy Statement?

This activity is a statutory process for the preparation and publication of the Electoral Register and related functions as a Registration Authority in accordance with the Electoral Act 1992 (as amended).

All electors who are resident in the County at the 1stSeptember and who will be 18 years or over on the following 15thFebruary are eligible for entry on the Register of Electors. Personal Data will be required under the 2ndSchedule of the Electoral Act 1992 – "Any person may claim to have a correction made in a draft register, including in particular a claim to have the name of a person added to or deleted from the draft register." When the Draft is published on 1stNovember a person may submit a correction up to the 25thNovember. Then this information is verified and adjudicated on by the County Registrar at the annual claims court held in December. Regardless of who is making the "Claim" – the person in question is written to & notified.

What is the basis for making the processing of personal data in this activity lawful?

Processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in Kilkenny County Council (Article 6 (1) (c) and 6(1)(e) of the General Data Protection Regulations, 2016). Specifically, the lawful basis for this process is the Electoral Act 1992 (as amended) and regulations made thereunder.

What personal data do we need to provide and why do we need to provide it?

To be able to vote in an election or referendum, a person's name must be entered on the register of electors for the locality in which the elector ordinarily resides. Registration authorities are required to prepare and publish a register of electors every year. To determine eligibility for inclusion on the Register of Electors persons wishing to be included are required to provide personal data;

- A person must be at least 18 years of age on the day the register comes into force (15th February)
- **Citizenship:** While every adult resident is entitled to be registered, the registration authority needs to know a person's citizenship because it is citizenship that determines the elections at which a person can vote. The qualifying date for citizenship is the 1stSeptember preceding the coming into force of the register.
- **Residence:** a person must be ordinarily resident at the address in question on 1st September preceding the coming into force of the register. A person may be registered at one address only.

On the basis of the above the various forms require your full name, date of birth, full postal address, Eircode, and certain other data. This personal data will be used for the following purpose(s):

All the information is necessary to validate each application for entry on the Register of Electors. Contact details are required in the event that information is not clear and needs to be verified.

Is the personal data submitted as part of this activity shared with other organisations?

Kilkenny County Council may, to fulfil statutory or regulatory obligations or in the public interest, from time to time, have to share personal data with other organisations. Where this is required Kilkenny County Council shall have regard to the security and integrity of the data and will minimise the data shared.

In this activity, the data will be shared with the following recipients:

Copy of the Register of Electors is circulated to prescribed Bodies, TD's, Senators, and Elected Members. The published Register is available to view by the public online at www.checktheregister.ie, Council Offices, Libraries, Main Post Office, High Street, Kilkenny, Kilkenny Garda Station & Kilkenny Courthouse.

In this activity, if the personal data is to be transferred to a different country, it will be transferred to the following countries (if there are no countries listed, it is not intended to transfer the personal data abroad): N/A

How long is this personal data held by Kilkenny County Council?

Kilkenny County Council has a detailed record retention policy which goes in to more detail of the time period for which your personal data will be retained by Kilkenny County Council and what will happen to it after the required retention period has expired. The data processed as part of this activity will be retained for as long as your name remains on the register.

What will happen if the requested personal data is not provided?

The elector will not be registered and therefore unable to vote and the Register of Electors will be an inaccurate Register.

Your Rights

You have the right to request access to personal data held about you, obtain confirmation as to whether data concerning you exists, be informed of the content and source of data and check its accuracy. In addition, if the data held by us is found to be inaccurate you have the right to change, remove, block, or object to the use of, personal data held by Kilkenny County Council. You also have the right to data portability. In certain circumstances blocking access to data may delay or remove access to a service where the data is required by law or for essential purposes related to delivery of a service to you.
