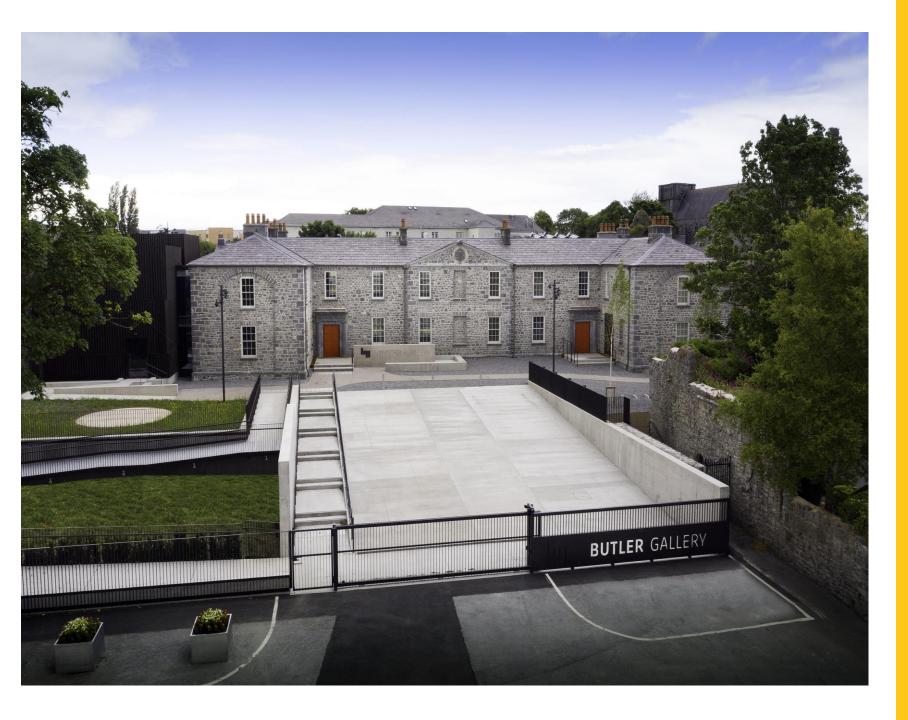

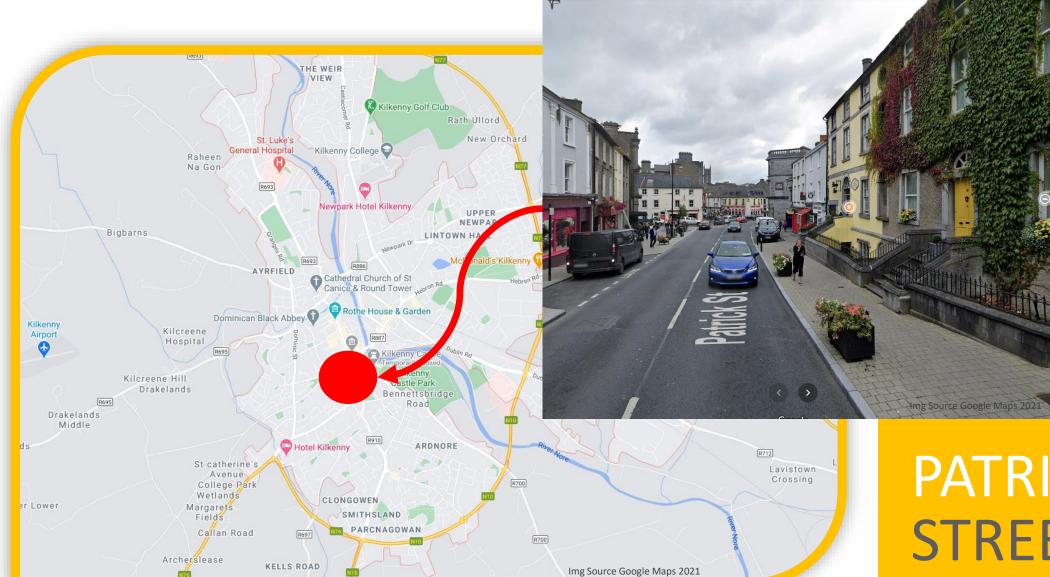

Capital Programme 2024-2029

- Total Estimated Expenditure over the six year period €832.8m.
 - Housing €483m 58.% of total expenditure.
 - Roads(Where Match funding required) €121.0m 14.5% of total expenditure.
 - Excludes the larger Road Schemes which are 100% grant funded.
- Total estimated grant funding €762.6m.
- Match funding required €70.2m.



Capital Programme 2024-2029 Housing

- Social Housing
 - Estimated spend over period 2024-2029 €482.9m.
 - 1,624 units to be delivered in this 6 year period.
 - 500 units to be retrofitted.
 - Construction/Acquisition 100% grant funded.
 - Significant cashflow requirement to fund purchase / construction.
 - KCC funding of €4.4m required to match fund the following;
 - Retrofit programme.
 - Affordable housing units.

- Active Travel funded projects €29.9m.
 - Average annual expenditure of €5m.
 - Projects are 100% grant funded.
- Breagagh Valley park & Link to Waterbarrack Roundabout Estimated cost of €5.2m.
- Loughmacask Link Road Estimated cost of €3.1m Funded from KCC own resources.
- Loughmacask Sustainable Link Freshford Road to Kilmanagh Road €9.9m, match funding of 255 required.
- Kilkenny Ring Road Extension -€40m Assumed 100% grant funding.
- Ferrybank / Port :
 - Belmont Link road.
 - Port Road.
 - Greenway Connectivity.
 - Abbey Road & Belmont Road Sustainable Transport.
 - Total Estimated Expenditure of €21.5m, URDF grant funding in place. Additional grant funding to be secured.
- PLEEP Project currently underway. Complete before end of Q3 2024. Estimated cost of €3.5m to be funded with new term loan.

CAPITAL PROGRAMME – ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT & PROMOTION.

Total Estimated Expenditure - €58.7m.

Match Funding of €17.6m required.

Abbey Quarter –

- AQ partnership responsible for the commercial developments on the site.
- KCC responsible for developing the public realm on the site.
 - Riverside Park, Brewhouse public realm, Mayfair public Realm, Tea Houses, Temporary Car Park all completed.
 - Urban Street and park to commence in 2024. Complete in Q1 2026. Estimated cost of €15.8m, Match funding of €3.5m required.
 - Cultural Hub & Board walk Grant funding secured for both.
- Partnership Equity Investment.
 - Estimated equity investment of €5m required in the Abbey Quarter Partnership over the six year period.
 - €3.5m already approved by the Elected Members.
 - This investment will be matched with a similar amount by the NTMA.
- Engineers Building Opportunity;
 - Diageo have agreed to dispose of the engineers block and other lands at the rear of the Smithwick's experience.
 - Strategic Location on the Abbey Quarter Site.
 - KCC can avail of significant grant funding to refurbish the building and bring it back into use. Estimated cost of €6.5m with match funding required of €2.0m.
 - Demand for "landing space" in the city.



CAPITAL PROGRAMME – ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT & PROMOTION.

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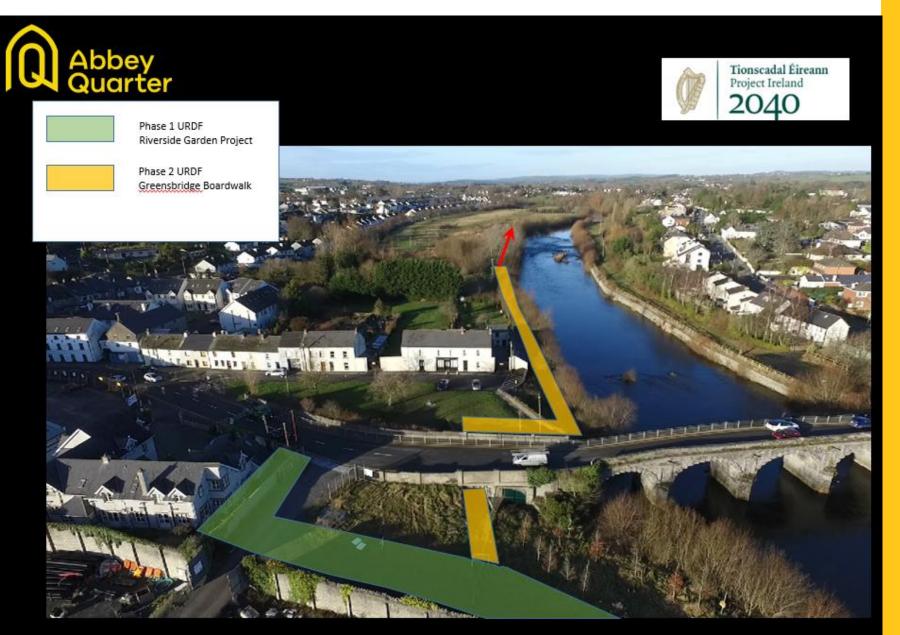
- Sweeney's Orchard Mobility Hub.
 - Proposal to build a multi storey mobility hub on portion of the Sweeney's Orchard site at the rear of the Kilkenny Inn Hotel.
 - Integral part of the SUMP process for the City.
 - Estimated cost of €15m. Match funding of 25% required. Application to be made under future URDF funding round. Preliminary design assessment required to confirm estimated cost.
- Vacant & Derelict Buildings:
 - Allocation of €6m under the URDF call 3 for Kilkenny City.
 - For residential buildings that are not for sale only.
 - No match funding required.
 - Cashflow facility of €3m required to fund acquisitions in rural Towns & Villages.
- Butt's Regeneration Project:
 - Grant funding of €850k secured to prepare a comprehensive regeneration plan for the Butts area of Kilkenny.
 - Additional €3m has been provided in the capital programme to fund implementation of the non-housing elements of the regeneration plan.
- Urlingford Pathfinder Project:
 - Urlingford is designated as Kilkenny's first "pathfinder" town under the Government's Town Centre first policy.
 - One of the key objectives Redesign of the of the public realm in Urlingford.
 - Overall estimated cost of €2.5m grant application to be made under the RRDF scheme.
- Waterford Airport:
 - Commitment of €400k from KCC to part fund the runway extension.





St. Francis Park & Street

- Planning Permission granted in February 2021
- URDF grant funding awarded subject to final approval form the DHLGH.
- Due to Commence on Site Q3 2024.
- Due for completion Q1 2026.
- Provides access and opens all plots for development





BOARD WALK PROJECT

GREENS BRIDGE

- URDF Funding in place subject to final approval from DHLGH.
- Planning Application to An Bord Pleanala in Q3 2023.
- Timing of Works is dependent on timing of grant of planning.

Capital Programme 2024-2029 -Corporate Buildings

- Meubles Building.
 - Site acquired in 2006.
 - Existing building needs refurbishment.
 - Part 8 Planning approval in place since 2013 For existing building and extension to the rear.
 - Estimated cost of €8.5m with match funding required of €1.5m.
 - Proposal to bring back into use to consolidate KCC office requirements.
 - Grant application to be made under the new THRIVE grant scheme.
- Climate Action Retrofit of key council buildings.
 - Estimated cost of €5.5m, Match funding required of €2.75m.



Capital Programme 2024-2029 -Recreation & Amenity

Total Expenditure - €90.5m, Match funding - €13.4m.

- Grant Schemes ORIS, Sports Capital, KLP, CRF, T&V, RRDF, TII.
- Projects in construction
 - Kilkenny Country side park, Millenium forest trail, Jenkinstown wood Trail, River Nore linear park board walk replacement.
- Estimated annual spend on ORIS projects of €1.5m subject to identifying suitable projects.
 - Match funding of 10% required.
- Town & Village Grant:
 - Urlingford community centre, Ballyragget Community centre, Madges garden
 Dunamaggin, Kings River Callan, Gowran Community centre.
 - Estimated annual expenditure of €1.5m subject to project identification. Match funding of 10% required.
- RRDF Funding:
 - Piltown Town regeneration project:
 - Grant approved of €1.7m, match funding of €430k required. To be completed by the end of 2025.
 - SEG to Glenmore connectivity link €2.35m, match funding of €470k required.
 - Estimated future expenditure under the RRDF scheme of €16m, match funding of 25% required

 - Total Estimated Expenditure of €31m, fully grant funded by TII.
 - 40% completed to date.
- Woodstock to SEG link Phase 1 & Phase 2
 - Estimated expenditure of €5m, match funding of 20% required.
- Woodstock House & Gardens
 - Estimated Expenditure of €5m.
 - Subject to project identification.
 - Match funding of €25% required.
- Kilkenny City URDF projects:
 - St Mary's Lane, St Kieran's street, Carneige plaza & Barrack lane,
 - Estimated expenditure of €3.7m, URDF grant approved, of €2.8m.
- Watergate Park, Market Yard public square:
 - Estimated Expenditure of €2.2m grant approved of €1.9m.

Total Expenditure - €90.5m, Match funding - €13.4m.

- Watershed upgrade
 - Estimated expenditure of €4.15m, grant approved of €2.7m.
- Watergate Upgrade:
 - Estimated expenditure of €2m,
 - Grant funding to be identified.
- Clover centre recreation amenity:
 - Estimated expenditure of €940k, Grant funding of €750k.
 - Lands of the former clover centre have now been transferred to KCC.
 - Masterplan to be prepared for the lands in conjunction with the local community.A

- Fire Services
 - 100% grant funded.
 - Urlingford Cost of €2.0m
 - New Station for Kilkenny City Estimated cost of €9m.
 - Grant approval to date €6m.
 - Suitable Site sourced.
 - Current status preplanning design.
 - Equipment ongoing requirement.



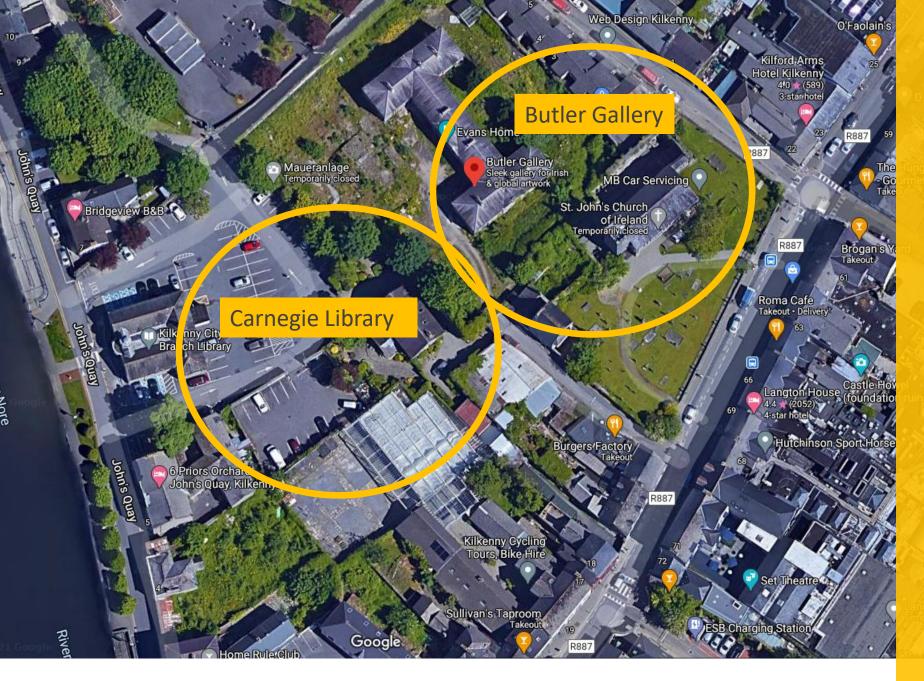
Capital Programme 2024-2029

Community

Total Expenditure - €28.7m. Match Funding - €4.3m

- Old Carneige Building:
 - Building to be refurbished to host locals studies centre.
 - Grant application to be submitted.
 - Estimated cost of €2.1m.
- Thomastown Library:
 - Grant funding of €4.0m secured.
 - Total estimated expenditure of €4.7m.
- Town & Village Renewal Projects.
 - Significant Investment to date across the County.
 - KCC Community to continue to identify suitable projects.
 - Annual expenditure of €1m assumed.
- Friary Complex Callan:
 - Grant funding of €865k secured to develop masterplan for the complex.
 - Allocation of €10.9m included to develop the complex once the masterplan is prepared. Match funding of €2.2m required.
- Watersports Hub:
 - Failte Ireland funding secured under Platforms for growth.
 - Facility to be developed in grounds of County Hall.
 - Estimated cost of €1.3m, 100% grant funding.

Capital Programme 2024-2029 -Tourism

Total Expenditure - €8.4m. Match funding - €3.7m.

- Museum of Medevial Kilkenny:
 - Combine the existing MMM with the Tholsel into a new unified tourism experience.
 - Construction tenders now received.
 - Construction cost €8m.
 - Funding of €4.5m now secured from Failte Ireland.



CAPITAL PROGRAMME 2024 – 2029 Summary

- Total estimated spend = €832.9.m.
- Match funding required = €70.2m.
- Provision needs to be made for cost inflation.
 - Estimates only available at this stage for many projects.



BORROWINGS - KCC

- Term Loan of €13.5m drawn down in late 2016.
 - Annual cost of €800k.
- Term loan of €5m drawn down in 2020.
 - Repayments of €300k provided for in the annual Budget.
- Term loan of €5m approved by Members at December 2019 meeting.
 - Not drawn down yet.
 - Repayments provided for in the 2024 Budget
- Total non mortgage debt drawn at the end of 2022 €18.5m
- Outstanding Commitments on completed capital projects
 - €8.5m.
 - Annual cost of €2.0m.

CAPITAL PROGRAMME 2024 – 2029

Funding Shortfall

- Council must have identifiable funding source for each project.
- Match funding required €70.2m.
- Funding available €40.8m.
- Funding Shortfall €29.4m.
- Current estimate of funding shortfall = <u>€29.4m</u> minimum.
- Opportunities for additional grant funding to be explored:
- Timing of some projects All of the projects listed will not be completed within the timeframe.
- Six year capital programme to be finalized and approved by Council subject to funding.
- Capital Programme will be reviewed annually.
